Happy New Year to you all and welcome back. The Spring Term is upon us promising new academic challenges and adventures, which hopefully will help your son/daughter develop their potential further in all areas of development. The following pages outline what is happening at St. John's in 2024.

Standardised Tests continue to track the progress of our students

Following the introduction of these tests during the last academic year, you have now been issued with a complete set of these taken in the Autumn Term. They made for interesting reading and I hope you have found them useful in helping you understand a little more of how your son's/daughter's results compare with those of their peers in the independent sector. They provide a comprehensive analysis of your child's strengths and areas of development in Maths, English and Science. These were then followed by a skill-set test, which helped us identify what type of learner they are. This is very useful information helping us understand how best to help each individual student by accommodating their style of learning.

Our next set of tests will be taken at the end of the Spring Term and on this round, we are looking to establish how much progress our students have made in the interim. These tests will replace our regular mini-tests for this term on these three subject areas, i.e. Maths, English and Science. Mini-tests will be set for the remainder of the subjects as per usual and these are taking place before half-term. No report will be issued for the mini-tests but parents will receive the examination papers to be reviewed and signed. Our students are becoming familiar with the type of questions set so we hope to see even better performances. Naturally, as these are 'standardised tests' each student's age is an important contributor to their final result. The older they are, the more challenging these tests become. We hope that by continuing to stretch our students, we will be pleasantly surprised with their outcomes.

Swimming Gala (First Form – Y7 students only)




The swimming gala is a <u>compulsory event</u>, and all students must attend.



What is happening in our Languages Departments? French penfriend letters throughout the year with our partner school

Since 2015, we have established and strengthened a partnership with our Parisian school, Jean Baptiste de la Quintinye in Noisy-Le-Roi, near Versailles Palace. All 4th Form French students and some 1st Formers have their own pen-friend with our partner school; they write to each other during the year, which affords our students an opportunity to acquire a greater insight into a different European culture and compare their way of life with theirs.

The Lower School French Poetry competition

Last term, the French Department organised a poetry competition for the whole Lower school. Each year group was given a theme to write their poems on. First Forms had to talk about their families and their pets, the Second Forms shopping for food and the Third Forms described the importance of friendship and their best friends. After a second selection, we decided on our three finalists for each year group. Their poems were selected for their creativity, originality, the rhythm techniques and even humour. Our finalists were awarded a poetry certificate of excellence. In German, Kathryn McFarlane, Amelia Jones and Arjunraj Kanagaraj received a certificate. In French, Kamron Quilling, Lucy Graham and Zahir Muhammad were the winners.



French and German Speaking Clubs for 5th Formers

Starting on Monday 15th January, after the mock examinations, <u>our 5th Form students</u> will resume their set lunch-time appointments in 5 Red to develop their exam speaking skills in preparation for their final G.C.S.E speaking exam. They will practise role-plays, photo-card tasks and improve their conversation skills. Immediate feedback will be given after each performance. They will also continue with their Prep session in 5 Blue on Thursday during week B to improve their examination skills and their grammar knowledge.

Starting on <u>Friday 12th January</u>, <u>German</u> speaking appointments will also be scheduled for our <u>5th Formers</u> at lunch-time with Mrs. Green in 5 Green to practise all their conversation skills, improve their pronunciation and develop their fluency.

Latin G.C.S.E. Clubs for 5th Formers

Starting on <u>Friday 12th January</u>, after the mock examinations, Latin <u>5th Formers</u> will resume their extra session after school to prepare themselves for the Language and Literature examination papers and develop their examination skills further.

The French, German and Latin Clubs

Every Tuesday, there are language clubs, which are aimed at the <u>Lower School</u> pupils to consolidate their language skills at 1.00 p.m. For the <u>German club</u>, pupils should make their way to 3 Red classroom and for the <u>French club</u>, pupils should meet in 1 Blue. Pupils have an opportunity to ask any questions to strengthen their understanding of the grammar but also to get support, if they struggle with their homework.

This Spring Term, pupils will also have the opportunity to improve their pronunciation and consolidate their singing skills in French and German. They will study the meaning of lyrics of different famous and trendy songs. The Language Choir Club will take place on Monday at 1.00 p.m. in Conference Room 1. Additionally, every second Thursday, starting on 11th January, there will be a <u>Latin Club</u> for <u>3rd</u> and <u>4th</u> <u>Formers</u> at 1.00 p.m. in Conference Room 1 to introduce pupils to the topic of Classical Civilisation.

What are we studying in PSHCE?

The lessons in PSHCE (which stand for personal, social, health and citizenship education), are focused on a variety of topics within the PSHCE education. The lessons are structured in age-appropriate ways and tailored to suit the needs of each year group under three categories entitled health and wellbeing, living in the wider world and relationships. These look at personal development, emotional and physical wellbeing, changes through adolescence, relationships with family, friends and community and of course keeping safe.

Since the start of the academic year in September 2023, the topics covered ranged from transition from prep/primary school to senior school, drug education concerning drinking caffeine, antisocial behaviour, age of criminal consent, gangs and keeping safe on the streets. Recently, we have also looked at how social media and culture impacts young people concerning their body image and wellbeing along with mental health conditions and coping strategies and support if required.

During this forthcoming Spring Term, the topics are as follows:

KS3

Relationships: Initially looking at friendships, when 'banter' becomes bullying, along with what to do if you feel they are bullied or see someone being bullied.

<u>Living in the wider world</u>: citizenship, understanding democracy and government within the UK, along with how laws are made and upheld. They will also be looking at their own rights as children and what is expected of them.

KS4

Relationships: Looking at banter, what banter is acceptable or unacceptable along with exploring when it becomes bullying. The lessons will also include cyber bullying, gaslighting and abuse.

<u>Living in the wider world:</u> Exploring what is covered under the Equality and Diversity Act, to protect people/themselves from discrimination, harassment, and victimization. Other lessons will also include looking at their rights as children.

It is a pleasure to report that the students thus far have been inquisitive, curious, and eager to learn more.
